



PRIVACY POLICY

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The Sea Swift Group (collectively, “**Sea Swift**”, “**we**”, “**us**”, “**our**”) is committed to protecting the privacy of individuals with whom it deals and handles personal information it collects and holds in accordance with the *Privacy Act 1988* (Cth) and the Australian Privacy Principles (**APPs**) in the Privacy Act as well as other applicable laws protecting privacy.

This Privacy Policy explains how the Sea Swift Group, in carrying out its functions and activities, collects, uses, discloses and stores your personal information. It also explains what information we may collect from you and why, how you may access and seek correction of the personal information we hold about you and how to complain about a breach of your privacy and how we will deal with your complaint.

Sea Swift Group comprises the following entities:

- vii. QGIF Taylor Holdco Pty Ltd; and
- viii. QGIF Taylor Bidco Pty Ltd.

What kinds of personal information do we collect and hold?

The type of personal information Sea Swift collects about you depends upon the nature of its relationship with you and your dealings with us.

Sea Swift collects personal information from job applicants, clients, customers, contractors, service providers, stakeholders and the wider community in order to perform its functions and activities.

Personal information is information or an opinion about an identified individual, or an individual who is reasonably identifiable to Sea Swift, whether the information or opinion is true or not, and whether the information or opinion is recorded in a material form or not. Personal information that we collect from you may include:

- a) your personal and/or professional contact details (such as name and title, address, email address, phone number, mobile);
- b) information about your presence on Sea Swift premises;
- c) information about your involvement in any incident that occurs on Sea Swift vessels or premises;
- d) information about a complaint or any feedback you submit;
- e) your employment history and professional and educational qualifications if you apply for a job with us;
- f) your drivers licence, passport or Maritime Security Identification Card number when you access certain IT systems; and
- g) your vehicle or boat registration and date of birth if you are issued with an infringement notice while on Sea Swift premises.

Sea Swift may also collect sensitive information about you.

Sensitive information is a subset of personal information and includes information about your health, race or ethnic origin, membership of a professional or trade organisation and criminal record. We may collect your sensitive information in certain circumstances, including when you submit a job application, or you are involved in an incident.

We will only collect sensitive information from you or about you with your consent unless otherwise required or authorised by law.

When do we collect your personal information?

Sea Swift collects your personal information when you contact us, apply for a job with us, register with our website, contribute to one of our social media pages, enter Sea Swift premises, interact with us as a customer, stakeholder or contracted service provider or submit a tender for the provision of goods or services.

How do we collect your personal information?

Sea Swift will collect your information in a fair and non-intrusive way. Wherever possible, we collect your personal information directly from you. However, we may also collect personal information about you from someone else in the following circumstances:

- a) if you are a job applicant, from job referees, academic institutions you attended and through police checks;
- b) public sources, such as LinkedIn or service providers such as ASIC.

Cookies

The Sea Swift website uses cookies to manage user sessions, authentication and to retain the users name and email address (where applicable) when completing website forms. If for any reason an individual wishes not to use cookies, the individual can choose not to accept using their browser. By not accepting cookies, this may disable or render unusable some features of Sea Swift's website.

Sea Swift's website may also detect and use an individual's IP address or domain name for internal traffic monitoring and capacity purposes or to otherwise administer the website. No personal information is obtained, rather the patterns of usage of visitors to the website may be

tracked for the purposes of providing improved service and content based on aggregate or statistical review of use site traffic patterns.

Why do we collect your personal information and how do we use or disclose it?

Sea Swift collects personal information if it is necessary to carry out its functions and activities, delivering its facilities and services, including:

- a) manage and ensure the safety at all Sea Swift premises.
- b) ensure safe maritime transport.
- c) provide cruise shipping and passenger terminal facilities.
- d) support customers and communities by delivering workshops and seminars and conducting business development to support regional trade opportunities.
- e) communicate with the community, government and other stakeholders about its services.
- f) to comply with its reporting requirements or other legal requirements under the Maritime Transport and Offshore Facilities Security Act 2003 (Cth), the Telecommunications Interception Act 2009 (Qld) and the Transport Infrastructure Act 1994 (Qld).

Can you choose to remain anonymous when dealing with us?

You may elect not to identify yourself or you may use a pseudonym in your dealings with us, except where it is impracticable for us to deal with you on this basis. Sea Swift will always allow you to remain anonymous where it is practicable and lawful to do so.

However there will be circumstances in which it will not be possible for Sea Swift to interact with you anonymously, such as in complying with its legal obligations, when investigating incidents on Sea Swift premises or complaints, issuing infringement notices under the Infringements Act QLD or considering your application for employment.

Who do we disclose your personal information to?

Sea Swift may disclose your personal information (including, in certain limited circumstances, your sensitive information) to:

- to our insurers and insurance brokers;
- to our commercial and joint-venture partners;
- to third parties who perform services for us;
- to law enforcement or government agencies, including where necessary to meet our statutory obligations;
- where it is required or authorised by law;
- where we use it for the purposes for which it was collected; or
- where you have consented to the disclosure of your personal data.

Information provided to the above parties will be done on a confidential basis.

Generally, Sea Swift only discloses personal information overseas if it is necessary to carry out its functions and activities. Personal information that you provide to us via online survey tools such as Google Surveys is stored by the relevant third-party survey provider who may hold your personal information overseas.

Do we use and disclose your personal information for direct marketing activities?

We may use and disclose your personal information in order to contact you about Sea Swift services and projects that we think may be relevant to you.

We may do this by phone, email, post, SMS or a combination of these. If you do not wish to receive direct marketing from us please use the "Contact us" section of our website www.seaswift.com.au or call us on 1800 424 422 to opt out.

How do we hold your personal information and keep it secure?

Sea Swift holds your personal information in a combination of electronic and hard copy files. We may combine personal information we receive about you with other information we hold about you. This includes information received from third parties.

Sea Swift takes all reasonable steps to ensure that the personal information we hold is protected from misuse, interference and loss, and unauthorised access, modification or disclosure by the use of various methods, including password protection and secure storage.

Please contact us immediately if you become aware, or have reason to otherwise believe, that there has been any unauthorised access, modification or disclosure of your personal data that we may hold.

In the event of a data breach, such as the unauthorised loss, use or disclosure of personal information, we will assess and respond in line with the requirements contained in the Privacy Amendment (Notifiable Data Breaches) Act 2017 (Cth).

How can you seek access to, and correct of your personal information?

You may request access to your personal information by writing to us or contacting us at any time at the details below. We will need to verify your identity before we can give you access. We will promptly acknowledge receipt, and we will endeavour to respond to your request within a reasonable time.

In certain circumstances, Sea Swift is permitted by law to refuse access to your personal information, such as where providing access would have an unreasonably impact upon the privacy of other individuals or would reveal commercially sensitive information.

If we refuse you access to your to your personal information, we will provide you with a written explanation for our decision and how you complain if you are not satisfied with our decision.

You will not be charged for making a request to access your personal information. However, we may charge you a fee to provide you with your information to cover administrative costs. We will inform you of any fee at the time your request is made.

If you think that any personal information, we about you is inaccurate, incomplete, out-of-date or irrelevant, you may ask us to correct it. We will take reasonable steps to correct it unless we disagree with your reasons. If we refuse to correct your personal information, we will provide you with a written explanation for our decision.

How do I make a privacy complaint?

If you are concerned Sea Swift may have handled your personal information in a manner that is inconsistent with this Policy or the APPs you can submit a complaint by contacting us on the details below. We will acknowledge receipt of your complaint promptly and may need to verify your identity and we may ask you to provide further information to enable us to investigate your complaint.

We will investigate your complaint and notify you of our decision and offer any resolution that we consider appropriate within a reasonable time.
